The quarter offers something for all kinds of visitors including independent shops, hands-on experiences, museums and attractions, boutique hotels, plus incredible food and drink.

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Did you know...

- The Jewellery Quarter is home to over 200 listed buildings, Birmingham's last remaining Georgian Square, and two Victorian cemeteries which both contain catacombs.
- The original FA Cup, whistles for the Titanic, and coffin fittings for Winston Churchill were all made in the Jewellery Quarter.
- Industrialists James Watt and Matthew Boulton both worked in the Quarter with the former also living in the area too.
- The Jewellery Quarter was the centre of Birmingham's pen trade.
 During the 19th century, 75% of everything written in the world was with a Birmingham pen.
- World renowned artist Banksy painted a mural on the wall outside the Jewellery Quarter station during Christmas 2019, the mural has since attracted thousands of visitors.

Getting to the Jewellery Quarter

Car

The Jewellery Quarter is well signposted from Birmingham city centre via the brown tourist signs. From the north-west/north-east take the M6 or M1. From the south-west/south-east take the M40 or M5. Multi-storey car parks are located on Vyse Street (www.bit.ly/BCCJQCarPark) and Newhall Street (www.bit.ly/JQNewhallCarPark).

Train

The Jewellery Quarter has two train stations. Jewellery Quarter train station and Birmingham Snowhill are both connected to major towns and cities across the UK with trains running approximately every 10 minutes to and from Birmingham Moor Street.

Metro

There are three tram stops in the Jewellery Quarter: Birmingham Snow Hill, St Paul's, and Jewellery Quarter station. It takes approximately 7 minutes to reach the Jewellery Quarter from Birmingham City Centre.

Air

The closest international airport is Birmingham Airport (BHX) which is a 20-minute train ride from Birmingham New Street from where visitors can take the tram or a taxi to the Jewellery Quarter.

Coach Travel

Coaches can drop visitors off on Branston Street or Fleet Street which are both in the Jewellery Quarter. Coach parking is available on Brewery Street (B6 4JB) which is 0.5 miles outside of the Jewellery Quarter. Booking is necessary via email: parking@birmingham.gov.uk or phone: 0121 675 5119. Up to 6 hours is £10, up to 24 hours is £20.

Getting around

The majority of venues and attractions are easily reached by foot. Some pedestrian footpaths can be uneven, particularly where traditional cobblestones are still in place. West Midlands Cycle Hire bikes can be hired from the centre of the Jewellery Quarter (B18 6NF) for quick travel across the district.
